

LilyBelleYorkies Puppy Care Instructions

Vet information:

- Your puppy needs to see the vet within 48 hours of pick up. Please take a poop sample in a baggy to the vet at this time. There are parasites that can only be detected by your vet and are cured by prescription drugs. It is common for puppies to have parasites. I am not responsible for vet charges.
- Puppies should have at least 3 vaccines to prevent disease.
- Your puppy will have had at least one vaccine before you take him/her home, please take the vaccine record with you to your vet appointment so that they may put you on a schedule.
- Your pup should have a rabies vaccine at 4 months and can be spayed/neutered at 4-6 months or as recommended by your veterinarian.

Feeding instructions:

- Your puppy eats Royal Canin "Baby Dog 33" mini bite dry puppy food. Moisten slightly with warm water.
- For the first few weeks after you bring your puppy home, make sure it has fresh food and fresh water available at all times.
- Once your puppy is 4 month old feed your puppy 3 times daily until it is 6 months old, then 2 times daily for life.
- Your puppy will come with a blanket, food, and toys to start you off. Use puppy potty pads for the best results in potty training.
- Make sure your puppy gets plenty of rest; **they are babies** and need to sleep often and eat often.
- Puppies must be supervised at all times, they are babies! Be careful they don't jump off the bed or couch, they will hurt themselves.
- Bathe your puppy with baby shampoo and conditioner. When rinsing, be extra careful not to get water up their nose. Use a low heat dryer to dry their hair, but be extra careful not to burn their delicate skin! Brush them gently daily to help them get accustomed to grooming.
- Never, ever hit a puppy, they don't understand. A scolding voice tells them everything.
